

Constructing Solidarities Through Power at the Margin is an initiative among engaged scholars and activists to share with the public, as an open source, the conversations held among them on possibilities of constructing a more humane urbanism whereby there is no homelessness and no evictions for maximized profit. This website reports on two main conversations so far. The first

was supported through a two-year effort of the "Insurgent Midwest: Transnational Dialogue for Humane Urbanism" project, which facilitated dialogues among activists in the US (Chicago), South Africa (Cape Town) and Mexico (Mexico City) and led to the 2017 "Constructing Solidarities for Humane Urbanism" symposium held at UIUC among academic and activists.

The second was a conversation hosted by the University of Minnesota in 2018 at the "Power at the Margins: Mobilizing Across Housing Injustice" symposium involving housing activists from the West and East coasts as well as the Midwest of the US. This website hopes to continue to serve as a platform to promote the trans-local and transnational solidarities that emerge through stories of power constituted at the margins by fighting back the unjust systems of greed and accumulation institutionalized by white supremacist patriarchal capitalism that produce homelessness and evictions.


AsiaLENS - GETSEA Simulcast Film Screening: "Hot Stuff"

An IGI Series on Global Responsibilities: "Palestine in the World"


Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CLACS)

Speaker: Nadim Bawalsa an historian of modern Palestine. He holds a PhD in History and Middle Eastern & Islamic Studies from New York University.

Tens of thousands of Palestinians migrated to the Americas in the final decades of the nineteenth century and early decades of the twentieth. By 1936, an estimated 40,000 Palestinians lived outside geographic Palestine. *Transnational Palestine* is the first book to explore the history of Palestinian immigration to Latin America, the struggles Palestinian migrants faced to secure Palestinian citizenship in the interwar period, and the ways in which these challenges contributed to the formation of a Palestinian diaspora and to the emergence of Palestinian national consciousness.


