Uman Tok: A Discussion on Period Poverty and Global Collaboration

February 13th 6:00 – 7:30 PM

Join us for a discussion on global collaboration and period poverty as we come together to watch the trailer for the compelling documentary *Uman Tok: Tailoring Hope, Renewing Futures*, which sheds light on the critical issue of period poverty in Sierra Leone. Set against the backdrop of a postcivil war nation, the film highlights the resilience of young girls battling the stigma surrounding menstruation while also calling attention to a local, grassroots NGO (*Uman Tok*) that facilitates health awareness, education, and sustainability of feminine healthcare. The event will also feature a short talk by the film's director, Professor Stretch Ledford, a panel discussion with partners from Fourah Bay College in Sierra Leone and University of Birmingham in the United Kingdom, information tables hosted by the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District and the student organization 'Code Red', as well as a virtual reality exhibit where attendees can use state-of-the-art virtual reality headsets to enter an immersive experience of Uman Tok's tailoring shop in Freetown. Beinecke Scholarship Information Sessions & Workshop

The Beinecke Scholarship offers a merit- and need-based award for U.S. juniors planning to pursue a graduate degree (PhD or MFA) in the arts, humanities, or social sciences. Eligible applicants must have received need-based financial aid at UIUC. The scholarship provides \$5,000 before graduate school and \$30,000 during graduate studies.

To apply, students must demonstrate strong intellectual ability, academic achievement, and personal promise, with a focus on a broad range of coursework. Professional degrees like law or business are not competitive.
