



# Pamela Calla's Talk "Against Extractivism: Dialogues among Indigenous Women and the Politics of Life"

This presentation draws upon decades of collaborative work with indigenous women throughout the hemisphere reflecting on the ways our anti-patriarchal and anti-colonial struggles engage the extractive



assemblages and structures of feeling in the "sacrifice zones" in which we work. In confronting diverse extractive regimes, indigenous women create ways of knowing, feeling and acting on the world that articulate and cluster around two central contradictions of capitalism: social reproduction and the ecological (after Federicci, and Fraser).

Dr. Calla is a Bolivian anthropologist engaged with issues of gender, race, class, and state formation in Latin America. She is currently a Clinical Professor at the Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CLACS) at New York University.




