The Program Coordinator for the Illinois Scholars at Risk (ISAR)

Working with the ISAR program to help scholars in danger from abroad by bringing them to the university for temporary hosting. Key responsibilities include:

- 1. Program Coordination:** Develop and manage an annual cohort of ISAR scholars, collaborate with host units and partners, oversee visa and fellowship processes, and maintain program statistics and reports.
- 2. Administration & Financial Management:** Assist in budget development, track expenses, handle administrative tasks related to funding and housing, and ensure accurate scholar appointment records.
- 3. Communication & Marketing:** Manage communication efforts, update the ISAR handbook, and coordinate with internal and external stakeholders to promote the program.

Qualifications

Required: Bachelor's degree, one year of relevant experience, and event or program management skills.

Preferred: Master's degree, experience with at-risk scholars, higher education experience, and familiarity with university procedures.
