





Presentation of Novel in Progress: What is Hidden Cannot Be Loved

Monday, February 12th at 4pm | English Building #109

What Is Hidden Cannot Be Loved explores betrayal, loss, and our modern cultural stew. Inspired by the thirty-year correspondence between my mother and my grandmother, Jews who survived the Nazi occupation of France, the novel tells the story of an unlikely love triangle-between a Holocaust survivor, a Sorbonne student from colonial West Africa, and a black GI-set during the tumult and renewal of post-World War II Paris. What Is Hidden Cannot Be Loved moves from the seventeenth-century Slave Coast to occupied Paris to Civil Rights-era Kansas and investigates the blurring, deliberate as well as unexpected, of cultural, racial and religious lines.





Jen Everett: Could You Dim the Lights?

Throughout her process, Jen Everett remixes images of herself in conversation with the materials she collects to talk about Black life, kinship, and collective gathering. *Could you dim the lights?* is her first solo museum presentation.



The Italian Cultural Institute of Chicago and the European Union Center are pleased to present the film concert of Tigre Reale (1916), with a live performance by Italian musicians Stefano Maccagno (piano) and Furio Di Castri (double bass). Pre-registration is appreciated but not required. This event is co-sponsored by the Department of French & Italian.

Tigre Reale, a silent film made by *Giovanni Pastrone* in 1916, is a poem about the power of love and the destructiveness of memory, the cliché of the femme fatale and the obsession with guilt. Over the troubled love story between the Russian countess Natka and the young diplomat Giorgio La Ferlita, weighs the tragic past of the woman. In the sweetened and rarefied world of a fictional aristocracy, unattainable Dannunzian characters are driven by extreme passions. The film becomes a luxurious stage for the divine Pina Menichelli, who offers here a symbolic interpretation of the excessive and artificial acting that marks and distinguishes some of Italy's silent cinema. Pre-registration is preferred but not required.

Eligibility




WGGP Gender Relations in International Development Graduate Minors
