This interdisciplinary conference aims to interrogate the state of the field for slavery and broader practices of unfreedom and

# The Second Annual Population Health and Armed Conflict (PHAC) Conference

**On Friday, October 27th**, the UIUC campus will welcome over a dozen international experts on the effects of armed conflict on population and health. Friday sessions are open to interested members of the University community. We begin Friday morning with a panel

discussion on the conflict in Ukraine featuring Professors Osana Kis and Marta Havryshko at 9:30 am.

PHAC attendees include leading scholars on displacement (Nathalie Williams, Univ. of Washington), environmental impacts of conflict in S-E Asia and the Sachel (Professor Kimberly Korinek), and aging in Southeast and Syria (Rana Khoury, UIUC). Issues to be examined include fertility (Ted Gerber, University of Wisconsin), housing (Amy Hagopian, University of Washington), social response to evacuation needs (Emma Mateo, Columbia), and migration (Stephanie Konig, Univ. of Nevada-Reno). In addition to our open sessions, on Saturday we will be holding focused discussion sections on research ethics, sampling, and exposure, and other methodological issues for studies of how armed conflict (and other disasters) write themselves into the lives of populations.
