Director's Welcome



On behalf of the Women and Gender in Global Perspectives Program (WGGP) at the University of Illinois, it is my pleasure to welcome you to the new semester.

We have a fantastic lineup of speakers and events planned throughout the year. Our programming begins with our annual Fall Reception on September 6 from 4-5pm at the YMCA. Our reception this year will include the WGGP community as well as members of the Illinois community involved in the Illinois Scholars at Risk (ISAR) Program, through which units host on a

visiting basis scholars facing severe threats to their freedom and well-being. The Fall Reception

Some highlights of this year's programming include a talk on September 12th by Lu Pin on "Resilience Amidst Repression: The Chinese Feminist Movement in the Era of Escalating Authoritarianism" as part of the joint Illinois Global Institute lecture series on China and the World. Lovern Gordon with Love Life Now Foundation will deliver a Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Save the date for our April 4-5 Transnational Feminist Conference. Hosted in collaboration with the Department of Gender and Women's Studies (GWS) and organized by WGGP GRID students [Nehal Elmeligy, Mahbubeh Moqadam, and Marina Moscoso] in collaboration with GWS Graduate minor students, this two-day event marks the 41st anniversary of a "Common Differences" conference organized by Illinois graduate students. Please check our website's home page to find information on upcoming events that we are hosting or co-sponsoring.

Since 1980, WGGP has had as our goal encouraging and facilitating research, instruction, and service focused on gender equity and human development. Our 103 Faculty Affiliates from 12 Colleges and 44 Departments from across campus comprise a rich community of scholars with expertise in these areas. We are always open to welcoming new members to the WGGP community, so get in touch if you know of faculty new to campus who might be interested in learning more about WGGP.

Over 150 graduate students have participated in WGGP through our graduate minor on <u>Gender Relations in International Development (GRID)</u>. We will host our annual GRID Alumni Lecture in April featuring Raiza Kolia, Co-founder and CEO at <u>Reaching Across Borders</u>. Stay tuned for more information. Annually, we offer a competition for <u>graduate student awards</u> that includes two full year fellowships (the Barbara A. Yates Fellowship and the Rita and Arnold Goodman Fellowship) and the Evelyne Accad and Paul Vieille research award. The deadline for applying for funding for AY 2024-25 is February 16, 2024. Stayed tuned later this semester for more information on the application process and details on a fellowship writing workshop.

This year we will be experimenting with a new format for our communications. Our weekly newsletters will be shorter, focusing on upcoming events. Monthly we will send a lengthier update in our *Monthly Perspectives*. This will feature updates about our faculty affiliates and GRID students. 
