"Feminist Collective Action in the Gambia"



New Frontiers PhD Fellowships 2023-2024

The New Frontiers Graduate Fellowships provide PhD students with a year of full-time research support, including a \$38,000 stipend, up to \$12,000 in tuition allowance, and an allocation of 50,000 hours on NCSA's <u>Delta</u> computing system. Funding is provided by the National Science Foundation.

Applications are now being accepted for fellowships to occur between August of 2023 and July of 2024.

Dr. Elena Kopteva: The Global Impacts of the War in Ukraine - Family and War


In case you missed the event, the recording from Dr. Elena Kopteva's talk is now live!




